that will just be the beginning. Ben, our contractor, pushes forward at a fast pace, so pray we can keep up. We hope to have four or five greenhouses active by the end of March. We still have tons of work for any volunteers. There is bulldozing, brush hogging, carpentry, driving men to appointments, and help with produce. Text me at 405-613-3120 if you want to help.

Due to the many changes of city regulations that cost nearly twice what building costs are in the country, we are having to postpone building our offices for now and just build a chapel building. We have started the paperwork process for that. We will tackle the office building after that project is finished. God is in the business of doing what men cannot do. He expects us to do what we can do.

We have had several guys who did not take thought about what they were doing to their body by what they put into their body. Some died, while others came close to dying before changing their bad habits and bad food. Too many think that by repenting and changing their heart, everything else will take care of itself. I grew up in Plainview, Texas. I had a good life with my mom and my dad. I had a bad experience with a teacher when I was very young. She permanently damaged my hand with a ruler. When I was 16, we moved to Roswell, New Mexico to help my grandparents on a farm. I got into trouble with the law when I was 20, and I spent five years in prison. A few years later, I went for prison for assault. It seems I spent a good part of my life in trouble for one thing or another.

A case manager in prison told me about Hand Up Ministries. I applied to Hand Up, and I was accepted. I am 57 old, and I am on SSI for mental health issues. I live the Hand Up's Chandler location. I miss my family in Roswell, but, due to my crimes and situation, I can't have contact with them. I have made good friends at Hand Up. They are people who help me to do the right things and live the way I should live. I don't remember when I prayed or asked Jesus into my heart, but I know I love Jesus and I love other people.

I don't know where I would be without Hand Up Ministries. Because of Hand Up, I have a roof over my head, and I have people around me who care. The people at Hand Up are kind and considerate, and they give me good advice. I have no real plans for the rest of my life, except to remain where I am and help others around me. I am so very glad to not be in prison anymore. I am also very glad to have a place to live.

I grew up in a very rough family. My

step-father was very abusive. My mom tried dealing with both of us as best she could, but she had issues as well. It was no better in school. I felt since I couldn't win at home with my step-dad, I acted out on the bullies at school, and I fought a lot. I got dope from the people with whom I got along. I was 13, and my use of dope led to an addiction that lasted until I was 50 years old. By the grace of Jesus, I quit dope. I have been clean for almost three years.

I went to prison for the first time in 1990. I was a pagan. My religion was paganism, and I practiced this religion every day. I got out of prison in March 1991, and I went back to prison in July of 1991. I got out of prison in 2008, and I had all new addictions. I went back to prison a year later. I got out and went back again. I spent 12 years in prison this time.

I joined Celebrate Recovery in 2016. By God's grace, I got clean. I am still in Celebrate Recovery, and I am on the leadership team. Here at hand Up, I am learning to put away my past and get forgiveness for the wrongs I have done in the past. I know life for me will never be easy, but through the Lord I can do all things as long as it lines up with Jesus' plan for my life. My goal is to go back into prison as a Celebrate Recovery volunteer and give to others what was given to me.

I was born in Oklahoma City. I was raped, and so were my two sisters and my adopted brother. I grew up in a rough, low income neighborhood. It was full of drugs and gangs. I spent my teen years getting into trouble and running with the wrong crowds. I got involved in the drug trade when I was 13 years old. I was running from the cops and living on the streets. I had godparents who tried to steer me down the right path, but I never listened to them. I grew up going to church, but I never knew God.

I have spent most of my adult life in and out of jail and prison. I spent 10 years in prison the last time I went to prison. I lost

I was born in July of 1965, and I was the youngest of seven children. Both of my parents worked, so I was raised a lot by my older siblings. We never had a much, but we knew that we were loved. We went to church, and I was saved at the age of ten. I joined the Army when I was 18. I was involved in a car explosion shortly after I joined the Army, and I was burned over 22% of my body. The doctor didn't expect me to live, and I was read the last rites. I began to improve, and I spent 29 days in the hospital. I was deployed to Germany after I recovered, and I met my wife in Germany. When I was in prison, I found God once again, and I relished what was missing in my life. I heard about Hand Up Ministries when I was in prison. I applied to Hand Up, and I was accepted. I have been at Hand Up for about three years. I am thankful for David Nichols and the men at Hand Up. I have been truly blessed since I got out of prison. I have met some very nice people here. God has blessed me over and over

again.
